Over the past year the building industry has had to deal with the impact of covid, supply problems with materials and storms,

Throughout all this Chris, Dave and Phil pressed Magenta on progress at Clifton Avenue. The builder for Delamere Avenue went out of business in the final stages. We've urged Magenta have the outstanding landscaping finished.

After years of delay, disagreements and discussion the Council's draft Local Plan has finally been made public.

We have been determined to get a new one in place, to ensure that derelict & brownfield sites are developed and that the Wirral's Green Belt remains protected.

In July 2016 & 2017 Phil stressed just how important it is to keep good agricultural land for food production.

In 2017 & in 2018 Wirral's slow plan making made the-Tory Government to threaten to step in. Many feared their new national building targets put open land at risk The Labour run Council began new consultations about the status of many sites around Wirral.

In October 2018 Chris, Dave and Phil, objected to the release of Green Belt land around Eastham & Mill Park.

The latest plan does **not** involve building on that land. Even so developers may yet challenge Wirral's new plan.
